And soon I knew I'd never let ^{him}her go



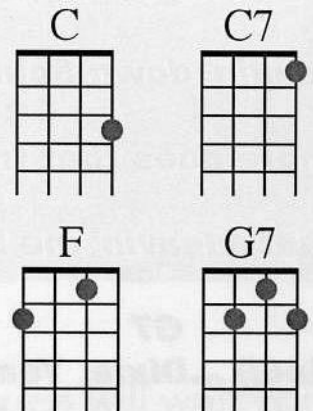
Edyie Gorme

Born in the Bronx as Edith Gormenzano in 1931. After she graduated from high school in 1946, Edyie Gorme worked as a Spanish interpreter for the U.N. by day, attended night classes at City College of New York City, and sang from time to time for local bands. She became a solo singer in 1952 after singing for Tommy Tucker's and Tex Beneke's big bands. In 1953, she became a regular performer on Steve Allen's Tonight Show, where she met her husband-to-be, singer Steve Lawrence. They married December 29, 1957, the week her hit "Love Me Forever" reached the Top 40 Chart. In 1958, Steve and Edyie had their own summer replacement TV show: Steve Allen Presents The Steve Lawrence-Edyie Gorme Show. Edyie reached the Top 10 in 1963 with "Blame It On the Bossa Nova". It was her last Top 40 solo hit. It was her first single released on Columbia Records. For both Steve and Edyie, their first Columbia singles were their biggest hits... and their last Top 10 records. Before the end of 1962, Steve hit #1 with "Go Away Little Girl," a Gerry Goffin/Carole King song that Donny Osmond would take to #1 again a decade later.
