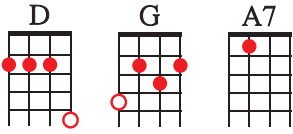
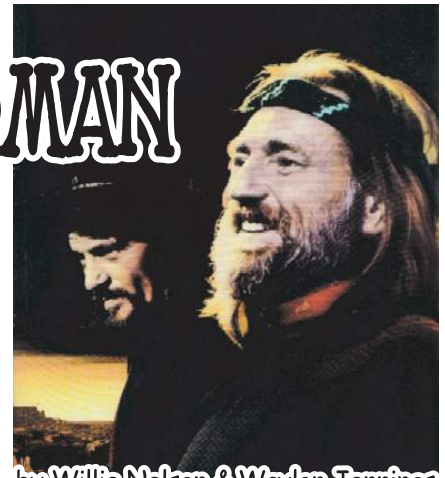


GOOD-HEARTED WOMAN



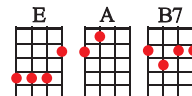
