CHORUS:

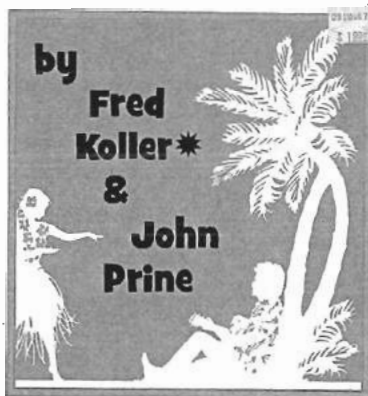
C Let's talk dirty in Hawaiian, whisper in my ear. **G7**
