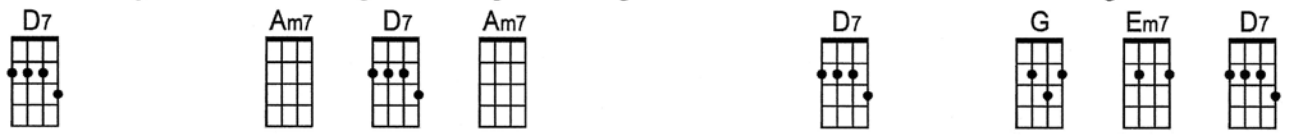


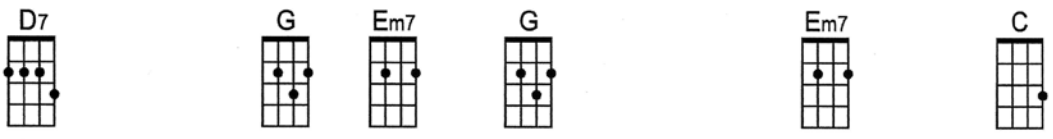

Getting to know you, getting to know all a-bout you



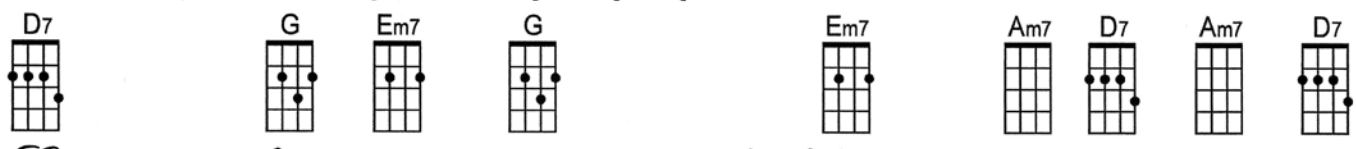
Getting to like you, getting to hope you like me

You are pre-cisely, my cup of tea.



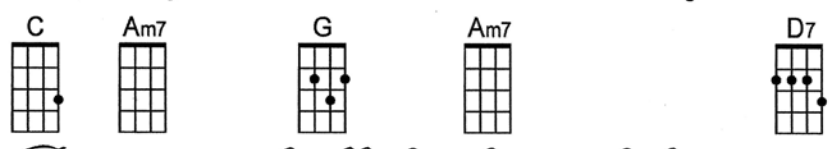
Getting to know you, getting to feel free and ea-sy



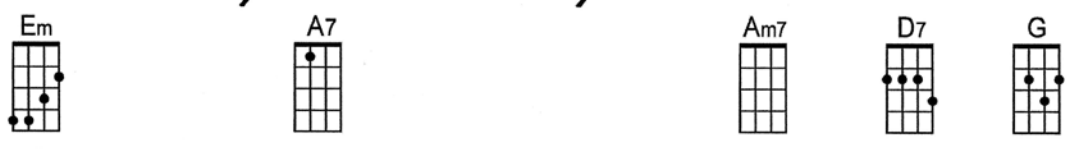
When I am with you, getting to know what to say
