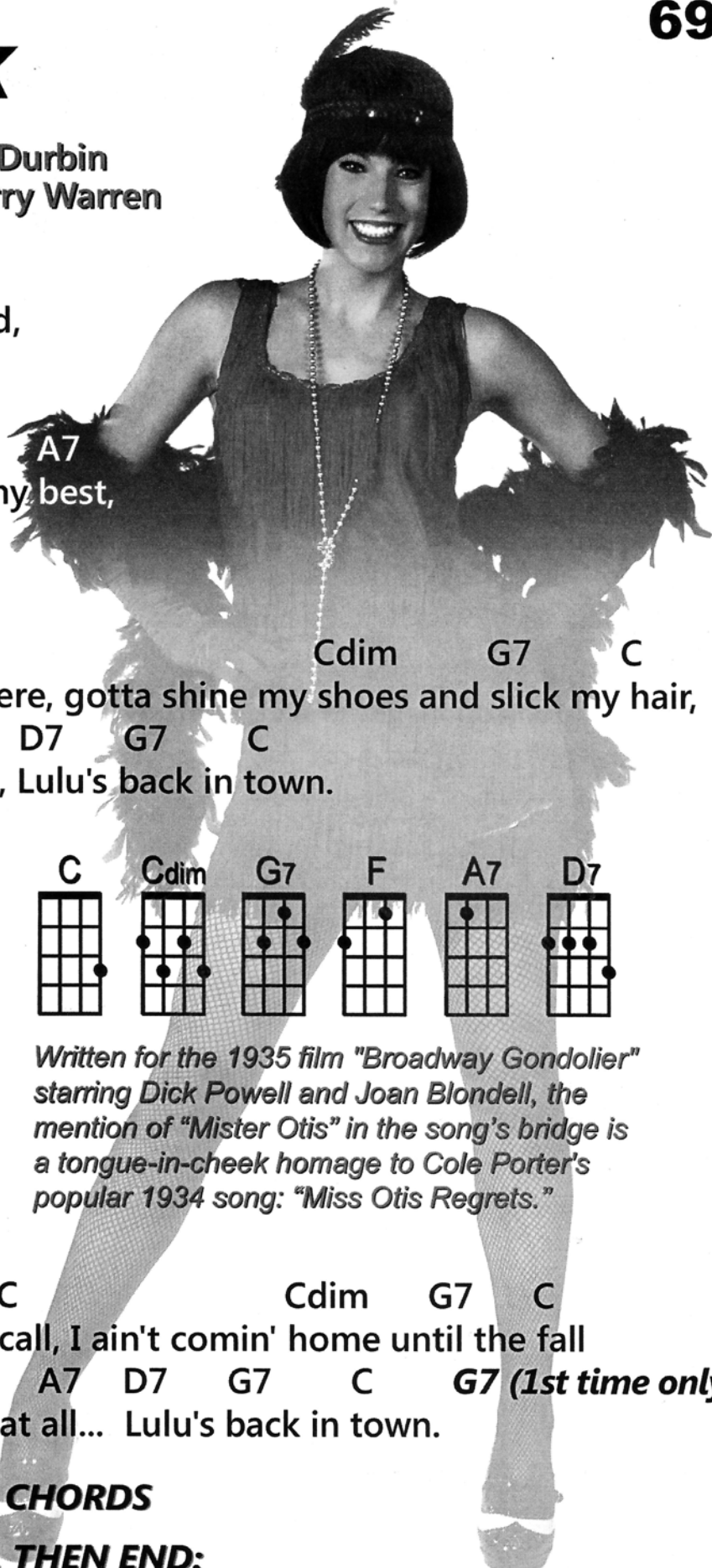


# Lulu's Back

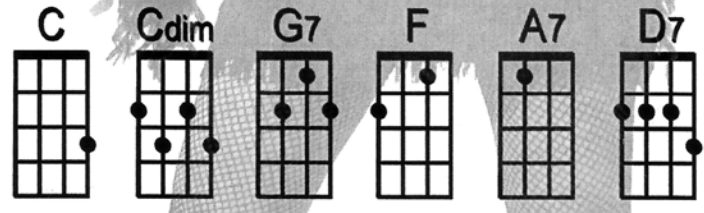


C            Cdim G7 C

**KAZOO SOLO OVER 2nd VERSE CHORDS**

**REPEAT BRIDGE & LAST VERSE, THEN END:**

F            Cdim C            A7            D7            G7            C            G7- C  
Yes I might not get back home at all 'cause Lulu's... back... in... town!
