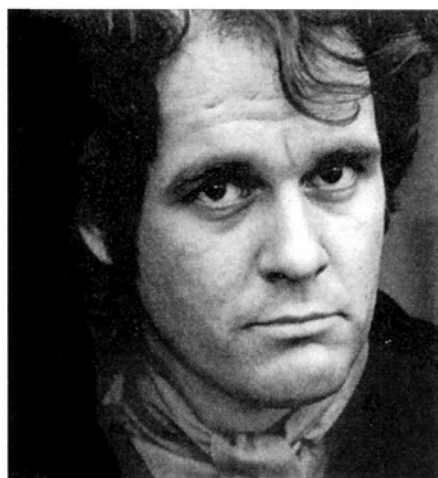


Reason To Believe

Someone like you, makes it easy to give, never think about myself,

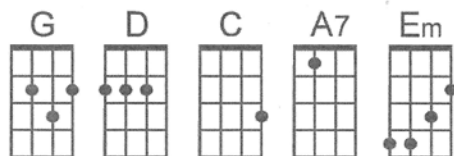
