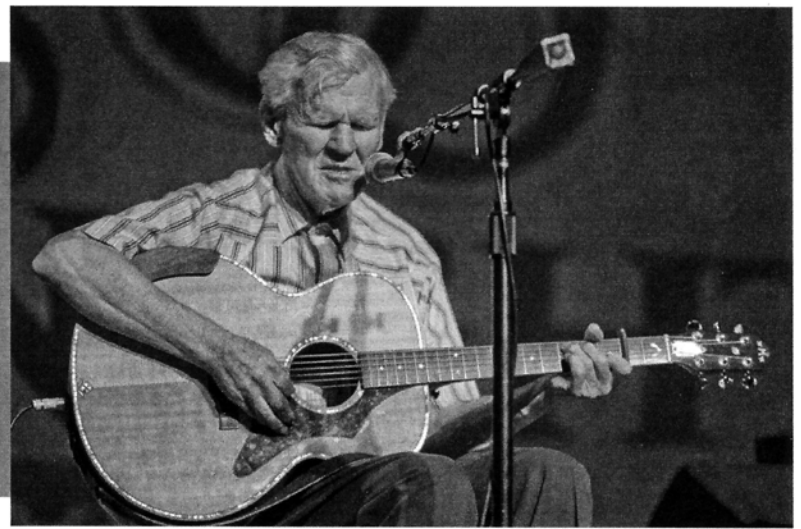


WALK ON BOY

Gonna help you carry your load.

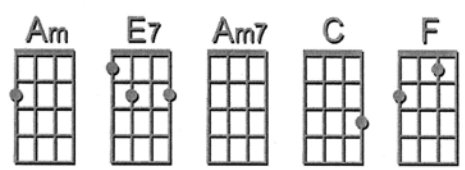


Am E7
