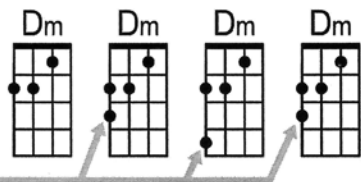

 which aired in  
 the U.S. as  
*Secret Agent*  
 from 1964 to  
 1966. The song  
 itself peaked at  
 No. 3 on the  
 Billboard Hot  
 100.
