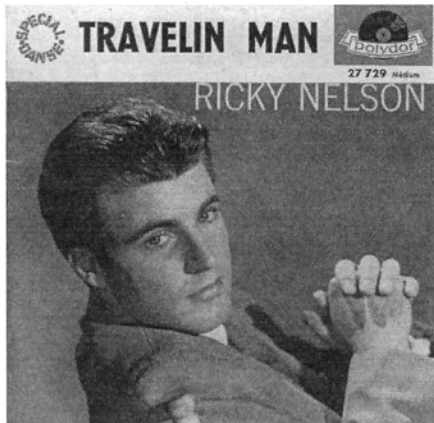
C Am C Am
